

Pickleball Paddle Stacking

1. When you come off the court after your game put your paddles at the end of the paddle line. Winners have the option of putting their paddles down first.
2. Paddles must always be placed at the end of the line.
3. You may put your paddles down as a single paddle, two stacked paddles, or four stacked paddles. Two stacked indicated you want to play partners with the other paddle owner, while four stacked paddles indicates four players who wish to play together.
4. Players may not stack their paddle with someone else's without that player's permission.
5. Players may only stack paddles at the end of the line. If you want to stack with players further along in the line, they must bring their paddles back to the end of the line to be stacked.
6. Those stacking paddles will give up playing time for the chance to play with a partner (2 paddles stacked) or in a 4-some (4 paddles stacked).
7. If you are a single paddle and do not wish to play with a particular group you may ask the owner of the next single paddle in the rotation to take your place.
8. I will not move a paddle unless it is my own. Players are limited to only placing one paddle in the stack rotation.
